Summer Reflection & Saturday Morning Meetups 9am-10am Saturday mornings: July 12 and 26; August 9 & 23




Brian died peacefully 8-1/2 years ago on the Winter Solstice from injuries he sustained while hiking 10 years ago in 2014.

Ron and Rene (Laureen) White became members of Salem in 2017 having moved from Lisle, Ill., a western suburb of Chicago. In 1982, on a June Sunday at Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Naperville, Ill., Pastor Gerald Nelson intentionally introduced us during a coffee hour. One year later, he officiated at our wedding and liked to say that he never introduced anyone else to keep his record perfect.

Ron was raised in Mineral Point, WI. (population 2000). His father was the town dentist, who freely made mouth guards for the football team! Ron sang with his mom in the church choir, but his favorite memory came from the church basement where potlucks were held and "Pasty", a Cornish meat and potato pie was frequently served.

After graduating from the University of Wisconsin, Madison's ROTC program, Ron served 3 years active duty with the Navy on the Hull (a destroyer) out of San Diego, and 17 years reserve out of Great Lakes, Ill. After returning to Wisconsin for his masters, he worked in the HR departments of Waste Management and Safety-Kleen, Inc.

Rene grew up in Maywood, Ill., a western suburb of Chicago where she attended all Lutheran parochial schools. The principal from Walther Lutheran High School brought Rene's diploma to her Westlake hospital bed, where she lay recovering from an emergency appendectomy during "finals week". It was a painful way to avoid all the senior final tests. After graduating from Valparaiso University, Valparaiso, IN., Rene taught first grade in the public school systems of Indiana, Florida, and Naperville, Ill.

Ron and Rene love Sundays being surrounded by others worshipping together through hymns, choir anthems, readings of God's word, prayers, sermons, communion and casual conversations. They are thankful to hear about opportunities like Family Promise, about ways others serve, and of local and synod activities. Each Sunday, they leave church blessed by this congregation and positive about the week ahead.

Call to Order: 5:30pm.

Prayer – Pastor Lori opened with prayer.

Approval of May 27th Meeting Minutes: Motion to approve: Treva V.

Second: Sue N. **Approved unanimously**.

Discussion with Pastor Andy Yee - Pastor Andy Yee (Assistant to the Bishop) as requested by the Mutual Ministry Team and the Salem Council, conducted a discussion and informational meeting regarding ongoing conflicts at Salem. His recommendation was that the Salem Council contacts the Synod's Church Wellness Network (CWN) Mediation Program for intervention. Amy Benson will make the contact to determine details and the fee schedule.

Pastor's Report: (Pastor Lori)

Pastor has been visiting parishioners who have not been attending services lately.

A new member class began Sunday, June 22 following the regular service. Twelve were in attendance with more expected to attend.

Ministry Teams Activity

Finance (*Peter/Susan*) (Detailed reports available)

Peter presented the balance sheet of May 31, 2025. He noted that a \$116,000 payment to Piazza for the downstairs construction project, and an extra payment of \$10,000 from Welcome Home Skagit will be recorded in June.

The ECLA Mission Investment Fund Loan is in process awaiting review and approval of required paperwork. As approved in April by the Salem Council, \$20,000 has been transferred from the ECLA Investment Fund to the ECLA Mission Investment Fund for a 1-year term fixed interest rate loan.

Peter and Greg gave an update on the downstairs construction project reporting that it is on time and close to budget with an outstanding balance of approximately \$140,000. A detailed presentation will be given to the congregation on Sunday, June 30.

Property (Greg)

We are now 5 months into the downstairs construction project and are on time for the targeted August 1 completion.

Approximately \$475,000 has been paid to Piazza Construction for completed work. Work change orders have totaled about \$13,000.

It is expected that the majority, if not all remaining contract fees will be due the first week of July.

Welcome Home Skagit will move downstairs full time about July 15.

\$10,000 requested from Skagit County by WHS to be used for Salem operating costs has been approved and received.

Worship & Music (Lynne)

The team met to discuss the past few months' services and music. They will meet next in August to plan for Fall.
